RECORDED VOTES..... are taken in the House at the request of one-fifth of a quorum and in the Committee of the Whole House on the State of the Union at the request of 25 Members.

QUORUM CALLS..... are taken to ascertain the presence of a sufficient number of Members to conduct business. A quorum in the House is one-half plus one of the Membership (218 when there is no vacancy). A quorum in the Committee of the Whole House is 100 Members.
